

# NC TODAY

North Carolina saw a net loss of 3,200 jobs in January amid cold weather and a resurgent COVID-19 outbreak. The unemployment rate declined alongside a decrease in labor force participation. Job openings have returned to pre-pandemic levels, but the number of employed North Carolinas has yet to fully recover. Business contacts surveyed by the Richmond Fed expect conditions in the Carolinas to improve over the next six months.

#### **Unemployment Rate Trend**




#### **Unemployment Rate Comparison**










# **Labor Force Participation Rate**






#### Unemployment Rate By County (Not Seasonally Adjusted)


#### Average Real Weekly Earnings (Private Nonfarm Sector)
