




Summary

North Carolina's economy continued to grow in November, with a net increase of 16,500 jobs. Our state has experienced robust retail sales and residential building activity, but employment remains below pre-pandemic levels despite seven straight months of gains. Business contacts surveyed by the Richmond Fed expect conditions in the Carolinas to continue improving over the next six months.
