



# Wage earnings improve following release, but remain relatively low




### Poor outcomes aren't caused by prison Low wage earnings before prison as well



## The formerly incarcerated are segregated into a handful of lower-paying industry sectors...


Primary sector of employment in North Carolina (2021)



#### ...and are excluded from high-paying sectors


Primary sector of employment in North Carolina (2021)

Selected large and high-paying industry sectors





# Fewer are finding work after prison than they did in the late 1990s



% employed within one year after exiting prison


Real median annual earnings
