

# NC TODAY

North Carolina's economy improved by nearly every measure according to preliminary labor market figures for February. One piece of data missing from this report this month is job postings. The Conference Board is experiencing data collection and methodology issues that have created the appearance of sharp job posting declines in NC and nationally, while JOLTS data reports available jobs in the U.S. going up. We have opted not to report job postings this month until this is resolved.

#### **Unemployment Rate Trend**




#### **Unemployment Rate Comparison**






#### **Total Nonfarm Jobs**




### **Labor Force Participation Rate**




#### **Residential Building Permits**



#### Average Real Weekly Earnings (Private Nonfarm Sector)




#### **Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims**




