

NC TODAY

This surely isn't good news, but a few items suggest this may be statistical noise and the state of NC's economy is still ok. 1. The number of people with jobs in NC rose for the month. 2. Few recessionary signs exist at the national level. 3. Recent trends are still positive. 4. Most other economic statistics (e.g. UI claims, retail sales, and job postings) are still positive. Follow the jobs numbers for May and June, with attention to April's revisions, to get a better picture about NC's job growth.

Unemployment Rate Trend




Unemployment Rate Comparison













Residential Building Permits
