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NCWorks Certified Career Pathways are a key strategy to strengthen the workforce and increase the percentage of North Carolinians with education and training beyond high school. Certified Career Pathways are integrated, seamless systems of education and workforce development programs developed by engaged employers, workforce development boards, high schools and colleges.

The newest pathway to be certified is the **ENERGY CAREER PATHWAY**, from the Southwest, Northwest and Western Carolina Alliance of Workforce Development Boards, which is comprised of the following six Workforce Development Boards: Region C Workforce Development Board, Mountain Area Workforce Development Board, Gaston Workforce Development Board, Western Piedmont Workforce Development Board, CharlotteWorks Workforce Development Board, & Centralina Workforce Development Board. The following 21 counties are included: Polk, McDowell, Rutherford, Cleveland, Transylvania, Henderson, Buncombe, Madison, Burke, Caldwell, Alexander, Catawba, Gaston, Mecklenburg, Lincoln, Iredell, Rowan, Cabarrus, Stanly, Union, Anson.
