





North Carolina Introduces the New NCcareers.org

Governor Roy Cooper introduced the new NCcareers.org July 15, an integrated career information system that offers North Carolinians ways to explore careers and job opportunities. Governor Cooper praised the portal during video remarks he offered at the annual Career & Technical Education Conference.

"North Carolinians need resources to navigate the quickly changing job market," **Governor Cooper** said. "The new NCcareers.org helps people research the education and training options that lead them to find good, high paying jobs available right now across our state."

As the state's economy continues to adapt to the impact of COVID-19, work environments and employers' needs have shifted significantly. The career portal will offer skills and interest assessments for people in all stages of their careers, as well as the ability to explore occupations and local job openings, and the capability to identify education and training opportunities tailored to an individual's career interests.

The core group of partners collaborating over several years to create the portal includes:

N.C. Businesses Invited to Meet Virtually with State Trade Offices

North Carolina businesses needing help in choosing the best global markets for their products can sign up now for virtual consultations with any of the state's internationally located trade offices.

"Our trade representatives can assess your product and help craft a market-entry or expansion strategy for their region of the world, connect you to the right international distributor and more," said Mike Hubbard, director of international trade at the Economic Development Partnership of North Carolina. "And it all starts with sitting down for this one-on-one chat."

The EDPNC oversees the state's exportsupport services. It is now scheduling the free appointments virtually because COVID-19 travel restrictions forced canceling the organization's 2020 Go Global Road Show in April.

The annual road show would have brought all the state's trade representatives from Europe, Mexico, Canada, China, Japan, Singapore, and the Middle East to North Carolina. The representatives typically travel the state for four days of individual meetings with businesses. Now the EDPNC is offering these appointments virtually through the summer and fall.
